

Gay werewolves, the symbolic life and religious fundamentalism: concerning similarity and symbol

Duine Campbell's paper attempts to address what has been called 'Dark Religion', the belief system that powers fundamentalist intolerance as it appears in all Faiths. It suggests that the origins of such destructiveness may lie in the difficulty of holding the tension between the material and the mythical.

Halfway through the delivery of this paper there will be a chance for everyone to pool some thoughts around one of the images that is central to Duine's theme. After the paper, there will be a short break followed by a plenary with Duine.
